PAC overview/explanation: Pernier Athletic Club (The PAC) was founded in 2015 by Coach Patrick Metelus and his best friend Reginald Toussaint in 2015. Patrick is the club President and Reginald is the Vice-President. The PAC does not take money from any kid, the only requirement is that you are enrolled in school. The club is funded by Patrick, along with donations from family and friends. Those donations are used for meals on game days, water for practice and games, powerade for the games, transportation for away games, and uniforms. Up until 2019, the club had only played friendly games with other teams in the town, and taken part in small tournaments. Pernier is a very small town outside of Port-Au-Prince, the capital of Haiti. In the late 80's and the 90's, Pernier offered the youth a plethora of activities such as football(soccer), games at the local school, marbles, mancala, jump ropes, kite running, swimming in the canals, hopscotch, hide and go seek, and access to unlimited fruits like mangoes and veggies from neighboring farms. With the growing population in the early 2000's, most people sold their land to combat hardship. All the places where the kids enjoyed those activities, started to disappear. Fast forward to now, the only activity that remains is football. There is one big field near the center of town that services all of the kids in the town. The PAC grew once Patrick started working for TapIn Mobile Solutions in 2019, located in Natick Mass. TapIn is an app that you can download, and takes care of all administrative functions to run a soccer league. TapIn launched the first ever youth league in Haiti for U6-U18, called Ligue Nationale de Football des Jeunes D'Haiti (LNFJH). With most of the registration taking place in Port-Au-Prince, TapIn put on a pilot league in September 2020 that ran through November, and the playoffs held at Parc St Therese in Petion-Ville in January. The PAC U18 played the opening game on September 5th vs Uni FC, which was broadcast on Facebook Live and seen by 25,000 people around the world. The PAC would finish the pilot season in 3rd place, just missing the playoffs as the top two teams made it. The PAC U18, considered the originals, brought much needed attention to a very small town. The club expanded with an invitation to compete in the 3rd division of the National Championship in Haiti. After the first 7 games of the season, The PAC sits in 4th, the second half of the season is set to start in the coming months. The top four will have a chance to compete in playoffs to win promotion to the second division. Right now the 3rd division team is semi-pro, if they win promotion to the 2nd division, they would then become a pro team. The club is looking to grow and have more categories for both boys and girls to participate in the LNFJH. For now they have a strong foundation with the U18 and 3rd Division team.
